In this paper, the presenter explains the strong movement advocating a growth in programs promoting Education for sustainability as a process which motivates and engages young people in creating sustainable futures, by building competence and providing change strategies to

assist people and organisations to move towards sustainability. The presenter will outlines key emphases in this field through discussion of exemplars from schools in Australia. She will invite participants to clarify the way that programs can be 'about' the environment, 'in' the environment, or based on the more holistic concept of 'Education for sustainability'. Participants will have the opportunity to evaluate programme aims and pedagogies, and then discuss and share their own experiences and views on International education in this field, in comparision with the case studies presented. In Australia, there is increased consciousness of issues related to personal and social sustainability, alongside issues related to the impact of climate change, debates about renewable or polluting energy sources, and increased awareness of global interdependence and social and economic divides. These issues will be discussed.
