



Concepts in PYP & MYP

- PYP has Key and Related concepts, used in UOI.
- MYP has Key and Related concepts in the SOI.
- Assessments to assess the understanding of Concepts.

Transfer of Concepts PYP to MYP

- PYP students have a superficial understanding of some of the concepts when they begin grade
 6.
- They cannot transfer the concepts across 8
 MYP subjects.
- They cannot apply the concepts in familiar and unfamiliar conditions.

Challenges

- Inadequate time to collaborate across PYP and MYP to develop common understanding and share best practices in context of concept based learning.
- Superficial teacher -understanding of concepts.
- Few authentic assessments are developed that assess concepts rather than content.
- Transient community of teachers.
- Orientation of new teachers in concept based learning, is an issue.

Recommendations

- In-house training and collaboration of PYP and MYP teachers to develop common and in-depth understanding, especially during the beginning of the academic year.
- Develop professional learning communities that include teachers of both the programmes.
- Sharing of resources among teachers.
- Mentoring new teachers.
- Develop a progression of concepts across PYP & MYP
- ◆ At least, map the concepts across grades 5 & 6.
- Follow up meetings through the academic year to monitor the progress of concept based learning in PYP & MYP.
